E-Rate Modernization/FCC Public Notices:

1. Public Notice released 8/12/14 (DA 14-1177): "E-Rate Modernization Staff Report and Online Maps of Schools and Library Fiber Connectivity Data"

Purpose: "two items designed to provide a concise view of a portion of the large amount of data in the *E*-rate Modernization proceeding. This is consistent with the Commission's efforts in this proceeding to provide open, user-friendly data to all parties."

- Data provided to assist interested commenters of the FCC's current Further Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (FNPRM).
- Assist in identifying underserved fiber via school and library locations nationwide for the purpose of determining funding for broadband service needs.

- 1. The Governor and General Assembly increased substantially the amount of appropriated funds for technology, focusing on Wi-Fi access, bandwidth and devices. The K-12 Committee, with the understanding that smaller, typically rural, school districts have challenges in finding the expertise needed to plan for, implement, manage and provide security for its current and future technology.
- 2. Melanie Barton and Kyle Herron sent a letter to Superintendents of districts with less than 3000 students. In this letter; the EOC and the Division of Technology offered these districts the opportunity to participate in a pilot program. The object of the pilot program is to provide small districts the guidance and support to make effective investments in technology before these districts expend any funds expressly appropriated for technology this fiscal year. Interested participants were to respond by August 25, 2014.

- 3. Up to five school districts, depending upon the availability of resources, would receive the following services:
 - a. Network design assistance, including wireless infrastructure
 - b. Malware protection
 - c. Mobile device management
 - d. Customizable Virtual Desktop Infrastructure (VDI)
 - e. Technology usage reporting (including location)
- 4. The following eight districts expressed an interest in the pilot: Barnwell 29, Barnwell 45, Calhoun County, Dorchester 4, Hampton 2, Lee, Lexington 3 and Orangeburg 3. Laurens 56 requested additional information.

AT&T Platform Change-outs

- 1. The AT&T and Bellsouth Merger effective now.
- 2. AT&T is transitioning Legacy Bellsouth Service platforms to AT&T platforms.
- 3. At 74% completion with 57 of 77 MIS upgrades to date.
- 4. At 35% completion with 247 of 700 ASE Migrations to date.
- 5. Just starting on AVPN migrations with 1% complete with 8 out of 870 migrations complete.
- 6. All jeopardies have been removed and projects completed on time as scheduled.

Cellular Contract Recast

1. Ruth Kirkland has worked with the cellular vendors to renew all contracts with the exception of Sprint who did not renew because of State Terms.

VoIP Solicitation

- 1. The VoIP solicitation will be executed around Mid-September 2014
- 2. Award anticipated by the end of this calendar year.
- 3. Existing contract expires March 26, 2015 and replacement will coincide with Fiscal Year dates

- 1. Project to improve/upgrade bandwidth monitoring software (NTOPNG) on K-12 sensors almost complete. Good responsiveness from development team in Italy. Bandwidth monitoring capabilities and reliability are vastly improved. Next phase will roll-out access / logins to K-12 constituents.
- 2. Failed Event Processor is limiting K-12 SIEM event processing ability to approximately 350 million events per day. Event Processor for SIEM delayed by manufacturer shortages. After some negotiation, should have an EVP here within a week and installed within two weeks. Once this is operational and logging sources have been balanced, expectations are that events will start peaking over 600 million events per day.

3. New servers are starting to arrive. Creating server images and starting to schedule installations again.

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- 1. The amount of all direct appropriations and budget request were revised again and a significant deficient was still present
- 2. K-12 Partners re-evaluated their individual budget requests and adjustments were made to achieve a balanced budget.
- 3. The following are the adjustments made to balance the budget.
 - a. SDE line item 8(Professional Development Instructional Materials and Training) had an initial request of \$215, 000; this request was reduced to \$100,149
 - b. SCETV line item 4(StreamlineSC Content Subscription) had an initial request of \$400,000; this request was reduced to \$200,000

- c. Under Pilot Projects there was an initial budget request for \$545,000 for Online Digital Music Curriculum. This amount was reduced to \$262,500 with the following conditions stipulated in order for the pilot to move forward:
 - Up to \$262,500 will be available to reimburse schools for a portion of monies paid for Online Digital Music Curriculum. In order for a school to receive this reimbursement, the school must have paid for the subscription. If requirements for reimbursement are met (these requirements will be determined and administered by SDE on behalf of the K-12 Committee) then the Committee will reimburse the school up to 50% of the subscription cost which will be negotiated by SDE. At the end of the pilot, any unused funds will be carried forward for use in the next fiscal year.
