## FCC/USAC News

- 1. No official Form 471 Application Window; last guidance provided was 02/01/2017 03/31/2017.
- 2. USAC has recently provided several updates to EPC including online Form 500 and search functionality.
- 3. EPC Public Profile Lockdown period and data push is currently underway.

## K-12 Committee Projects

- 1. SANS and GIAC:
  - 3 course vouchers and 38 certification vouchers are still available.
  - 29 school districts have not participated and have first priority.

#### SC E-Rate Consortia Update

- 1. <u>2016-17 Current: E-Rate Funding Year (07/01/2016 06/30/2017)</u>
  - a. As of 01/23/17 none of the five applications have been funded but one is under initial review, three are in PIA review and one has been moved to Final Review.
  - b. Waves 18-30 have been released and total \$13,918,909 for South Carolina.
- 2. Form 470s and other Contracts:
  - a. As many as twelve State Master Contracts will require State Replacement Contract corrective action during the E-Rate Form 471 filing window.
  - b. Hewlett Packard and Citrix will experience a lapse in E-Rate eligibility.
  - <u>2017-18 Upcoming: E-Rate Funding Year (07/01/2017 06/30/2018)</u>
    - a. January 2017: Bandwidth Forecasting and E-Rate Valid Data File.
    - b. February March 2017: Estimated FY 2017 18 Form 471 Filing Window
- 4. SC E-Rate Consortium Training Workshops
  - a. Hosted two training which reached approximately 35 entities.
- 5. Internet Migration

#### **DOE – MoDAM Applications**

# 1. Proviso 3.6 (9) Department of Education – Mobile Device Access Management (\$3,000,000)

Funds appropriated to the Department of Education for Mobile Device Access and Management shall be disbursed to school districts to procure high-speed mobile internet service for students that lack such internet service at home and are participation in a course of study that requires such access, as demonstrated by the school district. Districts requesting funding shall make application to the South Carolina K-12 Technology Committee in a form approved by the committee and the Department of Education detailing, at a minimum, the proposed uses of such mobile internet service, the number of students eligible for the service, the process used to determine student eligibility, and the process by which the devices will be secured and use-restricted to prevent breach or misuse. The Committee may approve requests in whole or in-part as funds are available.

The Department of Administration, Division of Technology may disapprove applications if the district's mobile device management plans are insufficient to properly secure mobile internet devices issued to students. The Division of Technology may offer mobile management services to applicant districts in lieu of a district-specific plan.

- 2. The Department of Education along with the Division of Technology developed an application form which was posted online. Any applications received will be reviewed by The Department of Education and DTO to make sure that security protocols are being met. If the protocols are not met the application will be declined. If the application meets current standards it will be presented to the committee for approval. The cut-off date for receiving applications is February 15, 2017. The Department of Education will send out a memo to the schools reminding them of the funding opportunity and informing them of the cut-off date.
- 3. The following schools/districts submitted applications. Their applications were reviewed by the Department of Education and The Division of Technology Operations and security protocols and other necessary requirements were met. The applications were voted on by the committee and approved for 100% of the funding amount requested.

4. The Committee will send award letters to the school districts and advise the Department of Education of the award amounts to be distributed.

Agenda Item 4	EOC – General Updates	Presenter:	Melanie Barton
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- 1. There are two items on the General Assembly's agenda at the moment that effects schools. The Palmetto Digital Literacy Project and the SC Computer Science Initiative.
- 2. **Palmetto Digital Literacy** is a program where Learning.com has partnered with the South Carolina Education Oversight Committee and the Department of Education to help prepare students and teachers with digital literacy skills. Funding is available to purchase K-8 digital literacy curriculum and technology skills assessments for teachers and students. School districts must have poverty indices of 80% or greater or be a trial and plaintiff district in the Abbeville equity lawsuit to qualify.
- 3. South Carolina Computer Science Education Initiative: Before August 1, 2018 the State Board of Education shall adopt grade appropriate standards for computer science and computational thinking and computer coding for grades 9-12. Experts and officials from higher education, business and industry must be included in the development of the standards. Not later than the 2019-2020 School Year, each public high school and public charter high school must offer at least one computer science course.
