





Three Goals



FY 2015-16



- Ten year document retention rules
- Three year warranty limit
- Funding support for services regarded as non essential to broadband connectivity
 - > Ineligible Examples: Webhosting, email, voicemail, paging, custom calling
 - *Phase Down Support Examples: POTS, Local and long distance phone service, Centrex, Cellular, interconnected VoIP

FY 2015-16



- Restricted eligibility for Wireless Data Plans
 - Predicable second priority funding
- \$1 Billion dedicated for Wi-Fi (2015 & 2016)
- Easier application filing process
- Faster funding commitments
- Migration to electronic forms
- · Technology Plan requirement removed

* Approved Technology Plans are required for state level funding compliance
