FCC/USAC News

- 1. 2017/18 Form 471 Application Window is 02/27/17 05/11/17.
- 2. Category 2 Budget multipliers have increased for FY 2017-18 to 1.3% due to inflation.
 - \$153.47 / student for school districts
 - \$2.35 / sq. ft. for urban libraries
 - \$5.12 / sq. ft. for rural libraries
- 3. FCC/USAC issued a statement regarding "hold harmless" for Consortium's in the event of incorrect data entered by a Consortium member.

SC E-Rate Consortia Update

- 1. <u>2016-17 Current: E-Rate Funding Year (07/01/2016 06/30/2017)</u>
 - a. As of 03/22/17 no new BEARSs have been submitted. Dark Fiber Form 486 is still "In Review" which, until approved, prohibits filing BEAR.
 - b. As of 03/22/17 Two of the five applications have been funded.
 - School WAN application has been assigned to Initial Review
 - School Internet has been returned for Additional Review
 - Library Internet is currently being revised by PIA
 - c. Waves 31-38 have been released and total \$5,059,068.90 for South Carolina.
- 2. Form 470s and other Contracts:
 - a. Replacement contracts continue to be filed.
 - b. State Replacement Contract guidance to Consortium members is expected to be released 03/28/17.
- 3. <u>2017-18 Upcoming: E-Rate Funding Year (07/01/2017 06/30/2018)</u>
 - a. Last date to file a Form 470 for 2017/18 E-Rate funding year is 04/13/17.
 - b. 2017/18 MOUs set to be released to Consortium members early April 2017.
- 4. Internet Migration
 - a. 44 districts, 20 library systems and 27 charter schools will be migrating by 06/30/2017.
 - Six districts and one charter school have migrated
 - 25 entities are scheduled to migrate by April 30, 2017. If completed as scheduled, migration will be 34% complete (32 of 95 entities).

DOE – MoDAM Applications

1. **Proviso 3.6 (9) Department of Education –Mobile Device Access Management (\$3,000,000)** Funds appropriated to the Department of Education for Mobile Device Access and Management shall be disbursed to school districts to procure high-speed mobile internet service for students that lack such internet service at home and are participation in a course of study that requires such access, as demonstrated by the school district. Districts requesting funding shall make application to the South Carolina K-12 Technology Committee in a form approved by the committee and the Department of Education detailing, at a minimum, the proposed uses of such mobile internet service, the number of students eligible for the service, the process used to determine student eligibility, and the process by which the devices will be secured and use-restricted to prevent breach or misuse. The Committee may approve requests in whole or in-part as funds are available.

The Department of Administration, Division of Technology may disapprove applications if the district's mobile device management plans are insufficient to properly secure mobile internet devices issued to students. The Division of Technology may offer mobile management services to applicant districts in lieu of a district-specific plan.

2. The following schools/districts submitted applications. Their applications were reviewed by The Division of Technology Operations and security protocols and other necessary requirements were met. The Department of Education reviewed the applications and using a tiered system recommended the following award amounts which were voted on and approved by the Committee.
